## **Message from the President:**

It is with great pride and heartfelt gratitude that I share the achievements of Prerna Jyot Charitable Trust for 2024–25. Guided by our enduring belief that compassion, dedication, and collective action can transform lives, this year we expanded our reach, deepened our impact, and served communities across multiple areas — women's empowerment, education, healthcare, environmental conservation, and humanitarian relief.

Our work began in the rural heartland with a visit to Pachgam village, Kheda district, on 22 July. After consulting with the local school principal, we distributed notebooks, mosquito nets, and study tables to support children's education and health. On the 78th Independence Day, we celebrated with students of Laxmi Vidyalay and Primary Schools 1 & 2 in Vejalpur Ward, hoisting the national flag and distributing notebooks. During the sacred month of Shravan, we shared puffed rice with Ren Basera residents and nearby slum communities, supported by donor Shri Rameshbhai Thakkar.

We extended compassion to individuals with special needs through the donation of a wheelchair and received generous contributions from supporters like Smt. Vaishobben Mehta, in memory of her late mother. Healthcare remained a core focus, with a Mega Medical Camp in Vejalpur benefiting hundreds, and a special camp under Vay Vandana Yojana and PMJAY (Ayushman Card) — providing 45 senior citizens with health insurance cards worth 5 lakh each.

Our welfare activities included distributing clothes to laborers at Ren Basera and laying the foundation for a shelter for stray dogs in Kavitha

village, Dholka taluka, with volunteer support from surrounding areas. We continued our service to cows and other voiceless beings. In December, we distributed blankets to orphaned children, farm laborers, and daily wage earners, provided compass kits to orphans, and served meals in honor of Saint Bajrangdas Bapa's death anniversary.

Women's empowerment was at the heart of our mission. We conducted sewing training programs in multiple locations, organized Sakhi Mandal meetings attended by over 25 women, and held awareness sessions on self-reliance and government schemes. With the support of Shobhnaben Jatinbhai Senva and AMC's UCD department, we formed two new Sakhi Mandals in Navavanjar's Senva Vas, strengthening women's financial literacy, leadership, and entrepreneurial skills.

In education, we provided books, school bags, slippers, and fans for Anganwadi centers, ensuring comfort and motivation for young learners. In Navavanjar Sarkhej, we offered food to children studying free of cost, built a protective shed for safe learning, and served meals at schools. Our book distribution drives gained media coverage, inspiring us to expand further. We also visited an old age home, sharing breakfast and companionship with the residents.

Every initiative — from distributing clothing and ration kits to raising awareness about welfare schemes — was made possible by our dedicated members, tireless volunteers, and generous supporters.

Your faith in our mission is our greatest strength. As we move forward, we renew our pledge to work with compassion and determination, striving for a society where dignity, opportunity, and kindness reach every individual.

## **HISTORY OF THE ORGANIZATION:**

Founded in 2009, Prerna Jyot Charitable Trust began its journey with a simple yet powerful mission — to bring meaningful change into the lives of those most in need. What started as a small collective of determined individuals with a shared vision has, over the past fifteen years, grown into a trusted and respected organization working tirelessly for social betterment. Guided by the belief that compassion and unity can transform lives, the Trust has become a source of hope and support for marginalized communities across Gujarat.

From its earliest days, the Trust has focused on practical, grassroots initiatives that empower people to become self-reliant. Skill development has remained one of our cornerstones — with sewing training programs held in multiple areas, including Koth, to equip women with income-generating abilities. These trainings, along with Sakhi Mandal meetings and information sessions on government welfare schemes, have strengthened women's financial independence and self-confidence.

Women's empowerment continues to be at the heart of our mission. We work to ensure that women have both the opportunity and the support to step beyond traditional limitations, discover their potential, and participate fully in community life. By fostering a culture of self-reliance and leadership, we have seen many women take on new roles as decision-makers and contributors to their families' incomes.

Education has been another pillar of our work in 2024–25. We organized book distribution drives in the Vejalpur ward, school bag distribution for underprivileged students, and even provided fans to

Anganwadi centers to ensure children learn in comfort during the summer heat. In Navavanzar Sarkhej, we supported 50 children receiving free education by serving them nourishing snacks, making their learning experience both healthier and happier.

Beyond education and women's empowerment, the Trust has worked actively to connect beneficiaries with government schemes. This year, we assisted 27 individuals in completing their applications for the Vishwakarma Yojana, opening doors for them to access financial and technical support. We also distributed ration kits and clothing to families in need, addressing basic necessities with dignity and care.

Our compassion extends to all age groups — including the elderly. In 2024–25, we visited a local old-age home, sharing breakfast, conversations, and moments of warmth with the residents, reminding them that they are valued members of our society.

Community recognition of our efforts has grown, with our book distribution and welfare activities featured in local newspapers. Collaborations with like-minded organizations, such as Samyak Charitable Trust, have further strengthened our reach, allowing us to spread information about opportunities like the Sakhi Mandal to more women.

Over the years, our activities have spanned food distribution, healthcare outreach, skill training, educational support, and welfare facilitation — always rooted in the belief that every act of kindness can create a ripple of positive change. None of this would have been possible without the dedication of our members, the tireless work of volunteers, and the generosity of donors who share our vision.

As we reflect on our journey, we take pride in the thousands of lives touched and the steady progress we have made. Yet, our mission is far from complete. In the years ahead, we will continue to expand our programs in women's empowerment, education, healthcare, and community welfare, with the aim of building a society where every person has the opportunity to live with dignity, security, and hope.



## **Education Support Initiatives**

On 22 July 2024, our team visited Pachgam village in Kheda district with a mission to better understand and address the educational needs of local children. A meeting was held with the school principal to identify pressing requirements, ensuring that our support would be both relevant and impactful.

To address immediate needs, we distributed notebooks to aid in academic learning and mosquito nets to safeguard students from vector-borne diseases, thereby promoting both education and health. Recognizing that a proper learning environment is crucial for concentration and performance, we also provided sturdy study tables to children who previously lacked suitable arrangements for their studies at home.

The spirit of education and patriotism came together during the 78th Independence Day celebrations at Laxmi Vidyalay and Primary Schools 1 & 2 in Vejalpur Ward. The day began with a flag hoisting ceremony, followed by the distribution of notebooks to students, reinforcing the message that education is the key to freedom and progress.

Further support was extended through the provision of school books, slippers, and essential study materials to underprivileged children. These efforts aimed to ensure that no child's education is hindered by the lack of basic learning resources or daily necessities.

In Navavanjar village, where a group of children study free of cost, we identified the need for a safer and more conducive learning space. To address this, we constructed a protective shed to shield them from harsh weather conditions, enabling them to continue

their studies comfortably throughout the year.

Through these initiatives, we sought not only to meet the immediate academic and infrastructural needs of students but also to promote a holistic approach—integrating education, health, and well-being. By engaging directly with communities, understanding challenges, and offering tailored support, we aim to create a sustainable and positive impact on the lives of children in rural and underprivileged areas.

These activities reflect our belief that education is a powerful tool for transformation. By providing the right resources, safe spaces, and consistent encouragement, we aspire to empower young minds to learn, grow, and build a brighter future for themselves and their communities.

## **Women's Empowerment**

Empowering women to achieve economic independence and self-confidence remained a key priority during the year. We organized multiple sewing training programs designed to equip women with practical tailoring skills, enabling them to generate their own income and contribute meaningfully to their families and communities. These sessions were more than just technical training; they served as platforms for fostering self-reliance, building confidence, and encouraging women to explore opportunities in entrepreneurship.

Alongside skill-building, self-reliance awareness programs were conducted to help women understand the importance of economic participation, decision-making, and long-term planning. These programs also provided valuable guidance on accessing resources, managing finances, and balancing household responsibilities with income-generating activities.

A significant milestone was achieved in Navavanjar's Senva Vas, where, with the generous support of Shobhnaben Jatinbhai Senva and in collaboration with the Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation's Urban Community Development (UCD) Department, two new Sakhi Mandals were formed. These women's groups act as strong community-based networks that encourage members to engage in collective savings, small-scale business ventures, and mutual support initiatives. By participating in these Sakhi Mandals, women gain not only financial literacy but also leadership skills, confidence in public speaking, and the ability to advocate for their rights.

The creation of these new Sakhi Mandals has opened avenues for

continued training, exposure visits, and access to government welfare schemes. Members are encouraged to start small businesses such as tailoring units, handicraft production, and other home-based enterprises, ensuring sustainable income sources. Moreover, the peer-to-peer support system within these groups fosters a sense of unity and mutual growth, making them a driving force for community transformation.

Through these targeted interventions, we have been able to create safe and supportive spaces for women to learn, collaborate, and thrive. The sewing training programs and Sakhi Mandal initiatives have not only enhanced skills but have also instilled confidence in women to take control of their futures. We remain committed to expanding these efforts to more communities, ensuring that every woman has the tools, knowledge, and network to become self-reliant and empowered.

## Healthcare Initiatives

Healthcare remained a core focus of our outreach this year, ensuring that communities, especially vulnerable groups, had access to essential medical services and health security.

A Mega Medical Camp was organized in Vejalpur, attracting hundreds of residents from nearby areas. The camp provided free general health checkups conducted by qualified doctors and healthcare professionals, covering a range of assessments including blood pressure, diabetes, and basic health screenings. This initiative ensured that early detection of illnesses could be addressed promptly, preventing more serious health complications.

In addition to the mega camp, a special healthcare drive was held under the Vay Vandana Yojana and Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PMJAY - Ayushman Card) in collaboration with Sitaram Seva Trust and the support of Shri Jaywantsinh Vadhela. This program aimed to extend the benefits of government healthcare schemes directly to eligible citizens, particularly senior citizens and economically weaker families.

One of the highlights of the camp was the on-the-spot issuance of Ayushman Health Insurance Cards, each valued at 5 lakh in coverage, to 45 senior citizens. This instant access to health insurance has given these individuals the assurance that they can receive quality treatment without the burden of heavy medical expenses. The camp also included guidance on how to utilize these benefits effectively, ensuring that recipients understood the process for claiming healthcare services under the scheme.

Both healthcare programs demonstrated our commitment to

bridging the gap between communities and accessible healthcare resources. By combining medical checkups with awareness and financial protection through health insurance, we addressed not only immediate medical needs but also the long-term health security of our beneficiaries.

Through such initiatives, we continue to work towards our goal of creating a healthier, more informed, and better-protected community.



## **Impact & Outlook:**

The year 2024–25 was a period of meaningful action and positive change, with our initiatives reaching a diverse spectrum of society. Our programs touched the lives of children in need of education and guidance, women seeking empowerment and self-reliance, senior citizens requiring care and respect, differently-abled individuals striving for dignity, daily wage laborers facing economic challenges, farmers working tirelessly for their livelihoods, and even stray animals in need of shelter and compassion.
